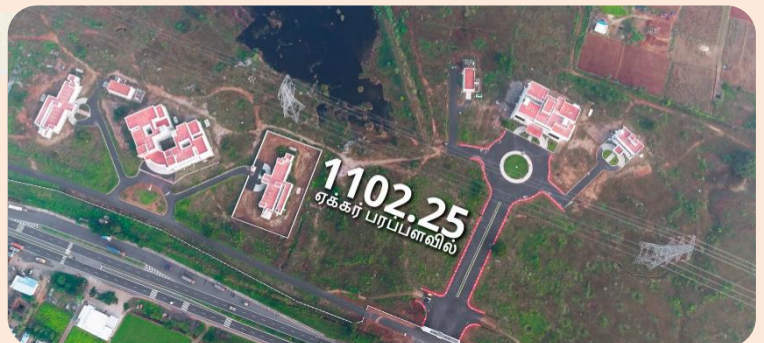

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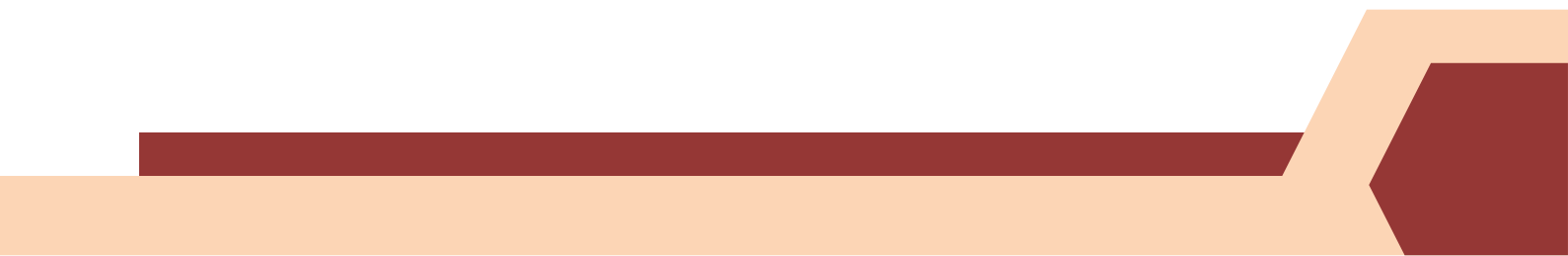


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1. INTRODUCTION

Considering the importance of the livestock sector in upliftment of the rural poor especially women and also realizing the maximum potential of the sector, the Government of Tamil Nadu has established an Advanced Institute for Integrated Research on Livestock and Animal Sciences (AIIRLIVAS) at V. Koot Road, Thalaivasal, Salem District in 1102.25 acres vide G.O.Ms.187, Animal Husbandry, Dairying, Fisheries and Fishermen Welfare (AH2) Department, Government of Tamil Nadu, dated 30.12.2019. This premier institute was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 13.01.2025 and the Directorate of AIIRLIVAS is functioning at V. Koot Road, Thalaivasal, Salem since inauguration.

OBJECTIVES

- ❖ Establishment of livestock and poultry farms on proven scientific technologies to be adopted by the farmers
- ❖ Creation of opportunities to students and researchers to undertake research based on the actual field demands and find suitable remedial measures
- ❖ Skill upgradation among farmers, field veterinarians and other stakeholders in the sector
- ❖ Creation of a platform for nurturing of startups
- ❖ Establishment of an Advanced Centre of Excellence for Livestock and Animal Sciences

Vision

To establish a multi-species livestock and animal sciences institute with world class facilities to impart quality education, carryout advanced research and ensure effective transfer of identified technologies to the stakeholders.

Mission

To test, identify and introduce newer and modern technologies in animal production adoptable under native condition and improve productivity and profitability in livestock keeping to the farmers in the state and beyond.

2.1. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Candidates satisfying the eligibility conditions given below as on the last date of submission of online application are eligible to apply. Passing the qualifying examination or changing the religion after the last date of submission of online application shall not be considered.

2.1.1. NATIVITY

- ❖ Candidates should be an Indian Citizen and **Native of Tamil Nadu State**
- ❖ Candidates who have passed VIII, IX, X, XI and XII Std. in Tamil Nadu are eligible to apply. **They need not submit Nativity Certificate**
- ❖ **The candidates, native of Tamil Nadu who have passed any of the VIII, IX, X, XI and XII Std. or their equivalent examinations from schools situated outside Tamil Nadu should enclose Nativity Certificate as given in Annexure - I, Page No. 35. The nativity certificate should have the mandatory statement that “the Applicant is a native of the state of Tamil Nadu by birth”**

2.1.3. STREAM OF EDUCATION

B.Tech (Dairy Technology / Poultry Technology / Food Technology)

The candidates who studied in the Academic Stream (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biology) are only eligible.

2.1.4. QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS AND MINIMUM MARKS

- ❖ A pass in Higher Secondary Course (10+2) / CBSE / any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto and fulfilling the following requirements are mandatory
- ❖ In addition, for those candidates who have appeared HSC Examination of Tamil Nadu State Board from March 2019, a pass in 11th standard examination is mandatory (G.O.Ms. No. 195, School Education Dept., dated 14.09.2018 of the Government of Tamil Nadu)
- ❖ The candidates who have passed 10+2 from open school or as private candidates shall not be eligible. Further, the study of biology as an additional subject at 10+2 level also shall not be permissible
- ❖ Only academic qualification examination marks secured by the candidate will be considered for the aggregate mark calculation. Grace marks for co-curricular / extracurricular activities will not be considered

2.1.5. NUMBER OF ATTEMPTS

The maximum number of attempts made for passing the qualifying examination is limited to **THREE for SC/ SCA / ST candidates and TWO for other candidates.**

THE IMPROVEMENT MARKS IN HSC OR EQUIVALENT EXAMINATION OF ANY YEAR INCLUDING OTHER STATE CANDIDATE WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED (GO. MS. No. 184 HE(J2) Dept. dated 9.6.2005 and GO. (St) No. 143 HE (J2) Dept. dated 6.5.2008).

2.2. COMMUNAL RESERVATION

Selection shall be made for different community categories, following the rules of reservation of the Government of Tamil Nadu. The percentages of reservation available for different community categories are as follows:

- ❖ For the Backward Class Muslims, it shall be three and a half percent within the thirty percent reservation for Backward Class as provided in the 1994 Act and in 2006 Act
- ❖ G.O. Ms. No. 50, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (TD-2) 29.04.2009. (16% seat offered to Arunthathiyars within the seats reserved for scheduled castes for admission in Educational Institutions)
- ❖ G.O. Ms. No.28 dated 06.04.2015 [Inclusion of Transgender / Eunuch (Thirunangai / Aravani) in the list of Most Backward Classes]

The list of communities eligible to compete against the reserved quota is furnished in Appendix - I (List of Communities) in Page No 21.

- ❖ **Tamil Nadu native candidates alone** will be considered for communal reservation. The community recorded in the certificate of candidates native of Tamil Nadu should appear in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu
- ❖ The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have obtained a permanent community certificate in permanent card format / electronic form / digitally signed e-certificate only from the authorities given above on or before the last date prescribed for submission of online application. Community certificates obtained after the last date prescribed for submission of online applications will not be considered
- ❖ Community certificates obtained from other states will not be considered for communal reservation, but will be considered as open category (OC) only if he / she fulfills the eligibility norms otherwise
- ❖ For communities linked with Districts, the candidates should obtain their community certificate in the respective district except the communities mentioned in G.O. (Ms) No. 95 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dated 28.10.2009. Such of those community certificates obtained on or after 28.10.2009 will be considered. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered
- ❖ Candidates who have not produced the Community Certificate in the form of Permanent Community Certificate [Card] or electronic form / digitally signed e-certificate at the time of verification of original certificates, their application will be treated under “Open Competition (OC)”. The candidate is further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions and norms prescribed for OC will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the norms of OC, their applications are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained
- ❖ If a candidate submits a false / fabricated Community Certificate or Nativity Certificate or any other Certificate and found at a later point during the course of the study, it will result in expulsion of the candidate from the course and also legal proceedings / criminal action will be initiated against the candidate and their parents as per the provisions of law

2.3. SPECIAL CATEGORIES

The seats earmarked for the special categories such as Differently-abled will be allotted following the horizontal reservation. The seats will be allotted as per the rank in the concerned special category and accordingly, those seats will be deducted in concerned community. If adequate number of eligible candidates is not available under special category, then the earmarked unfilled seats will be reverted back to the General category.

2.3.1. DIFFERENTLY-ABLED

Five per cent (5%) of the total number of seats is reserved for the Differently abled candidates / Persons with Benchmark Disabilities as per The Gazette of India- Extraordinary. Part III-Section 4. No.286 published on 08.07.2016, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers welfare (Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries).

THE RESERVATION UNDER SPECIFIED DISABILITY IS PROVIDED RANGING FROM 40% TO 80% as per Lr. No. 11404/AH6/2017-1 Dated: 26.07.2017 of the AHD&F (AH6) Dept., Govt. of Tamil Nadu, Right of Persons with Disability Act, 2016 and G.O (D) No.744, Health and Family Welfare Dept., dated 15.07.2024. The guidelines regarding the eligibility of candidates under Differently abled quota is given in **Annexure II - page No. 36**.

Candidates with less than 40% disabilities are NOT ELIGIBLE for reservation, provided that the candidates are eligible to apply for Undergraduate Degree Programmes of AIIRLIVAS under general category. However, such candidates have to **submit a physical fitness certificate**. The presence of significant Locomotor Disability with or without any other significant disability- such as visual or hearing-speech or learning etc. which will make it difficult for the candidate to pursue and complete the course satisfactorily and may significantly increase the risk to the candidate – may be declared **INELIGIBLE** for admission. Other conditions for admission to the degree programmes are applicable as in the case of General Category.

The candidate appearing for counselling will be physically examined by the medical officer / board specifically constituted for the purpose and **whose decision on eligibility is final**. The candidates who have previously applied for UG degree programmes under the differently-abled category and made ineligible by the Medical Board are not eligible to apply for the subsequent years under this category. Such applications will be summarily rejected. The candidates selected under differently-abled category will be exempted from paying tuition fees, special fees and examination fees of the total college fees prescribed by the University as per GO MS. No. 113 dated 28.06.2024 of Government of Tamil Nadu.

2.3.2. GOVERNMENT SCHOOL STUDENTS (7.5% seats on preferential basis)

The "Tamil Nadu admission to Undergraduate Professional Courses on Preferential basis to students of Government Schools Act, 2021" (Act No. 14 of 2021) provides 7.5% seats on preferential basis (Horizontal reservation in each category of vertical reservation followed in the state of Tamil Nadu without affecting the existing 69% of rule of reservation in force) to the students who have studied from 6th to 12th standard in the State Government schools, in admission. The candidates from Academic Stream of the qualifying examination who wish

to apply for B.Tech (Dairy Technology / Poultry Technology / Food Technology) degree programmes under Government schools' student category should correctly mention the unique EMIS number (Educational Management Information System) as issued by the Government of Tamil Nadu (School Education Department) in Online application, which will be verified.

- "Government schools" mean and include Government schools, Corporation schools, Municipal schools, Panchayat Union schools, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare schools, Kallar Reclamation schools, Forest Department schools and other schools managed by Government departments
- Student studied in Government schools shall also be entitled to compete for the Government seats, other than those set apart on preferential basis, along with the students who studied in private school
- Admission of Students studied in Government schools on preferential basis shall be made by following the reservation as per the law in force
- Notwithstanding anything contained in above, where adequate numbers of students studied in Government schools are not available for admission to the seats set apart on preferential basis, such unfilled seats shall be filled up with the students who studied in private schools

The seat allotment will be followed as mentioned in the GO (Ms) No. 167, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated 31.08.2021.

3. ONLINE APPLICATION ADMISSION AND FEES

3.1. SUBMISSION OF ONLINE APPLICATION

Candidates should fill, upload necessary documents / certificates and submit the application online at <https://www.aiirlivas.com> on or before 22.08.2025, 5.00 PM. Candidates who are willing to apply for B.Tech (Dairy Technology), B.Tech (Poultry Technology) and B.Tech (Food Technology) can submit their online application through a single pooled B.Tech application.

While applying online, the candidates are requested to give their **order of programme preference for B.Tech, which will be considered for Online counselling. After submission of online application, the order of programme preference (B.Tech) cannot be changed.** Hence, the candidates are requested to opt their preference of programme carefully before submission.

There is **NO NEED TO SEND THE HARD COPY OF APPLICATION TO THE INSTITUTE**. However, the candidates may take a print out of the application for future reference.

While filling-up of application form, the candidate has to make online payment of prescribed application fee, through Credit cards / Debit cards / Internet Banking / IMPS / UPI.

PAYMENT BY ANY OTHER MODE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

3.2. MODE OF SELECTION

Candidates will be selected based on their marks in the qualifying examination as computed below:

3.2.1. NORMALIZATION OF MARKS

As per Tamil Nadu Act No. 3 of 2007 dated 05.03.2007, the marks obtained by the students in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by various Boards or Authorities shall be equated with the marks obtained by them in the same subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the State Board of Tamil Nadu by adopting the method of normalization.

For example, if the highest mark secured by a student of the State Board of Tamil Nadu in Physics is 100% and the highest mark secured by a student of a Board other than Tamil Nadu State Board in the same subject is 90%, both the highest marks will be considered to be equal to 100%. If a student of the other Board secures 60 marks in Physics when the first mark in Physics in the same Board is 90, then the 60 marks of the Board will be considered to be equal to 66.67 marks of the Tamil Nadu State Board, as computed below:

$$\frac{60}{90} \times 100 = 66.67\%$$

After the normalization of marks in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the other Board, the qualified students of different Boards shall be ranked in a common merit list. The merit list will be prepared for the total marks of 200.

3.2.2. *Inter-se Merit*

In cases, where more than one candidate has got the same mark in the common merit list, the *inter-se* merit among such candidates shall be determined as per G.O. Ms. No.73, Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries (AH6) Department, dated 24-05-2007 for the following degree programmes in the order of priority, as specified below:

Candidates from Academic Stream

- ❖ Percentage of marks in Mathematics
- ❖ Percentage of marks in Biology
- ❖ Percentage of marks in Physics
- ❖ Date of birth: Seniority in age will be given preference
- ❖ Random number assigned: The highest value will be given preference

3.3. RANKLIST AND COUNSELLING

The rank list for admission to B.Tech degree programmes will be published in the Website - <https://www.aiirlivas.com>

3.3.1. In-person Counselling

- Counselling for the Special Categories (Differently-abled) and 7.5 % Government School quota will be conducted prior to General Category counselling. The candidates have to appear **IN PERSON** along with the relevant original certificates at the venue specified by the AIIRLIVAS

3.3.2. Online Counselling

- Online Counselling will be conducted on the basis of order of merit, rules of reservation of Government of Tamil Nadu and preference opted by the candidate. **The eligible candidates need to register for participation in online counselling**
- The selected candidates shall download their admission letter. They have to report to the mentioned venue within the prescribed time to submit their certificates / documents for verification and pay the prescribed fee. Upon submission of necessary documents and

payment of prescribed fee, the candidate will be admitted to the programme and admission slip will be issued to the candidate and they shall report to the Institute on the prescribed date of registration / orientation

- The programme preference shall be made by the candidate only once for the counselling. The candidates who failed to register for online counselling **WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION THEREAFTER**
- Based on the vacancy position, next round of counselling will be conducted. Sliding procedure (internal counselling for programme change based on the rank and preference for the eligible candidates) will be followed for already admitted candidates. Further, for the resultant vacancies, candidates will be selected based on the counselling registration
- **MERE REGISTRATION IN THE ONLINE COUNSELLING DOES NOT ENSURE SELECTION / ADMISSION OR ANY OTHER RIGHTS TO THE CANDIDATES SO REGISTERED**
- The detailed online counselling schedule and instructions for both General / Special categories will be hosted in the website later and the candidates are requested to keep checking the website regularly for the counselling particulars and updates

3.3.3. Counselling fee

- Candidates who are called for participating in the In-person / Online counselling need to pay **one-time non-refundable Counselling fee** of Rs. 100/- for SC / SCA / ST candidates and Rs. 200/- for Others. The number of candidates allowed for the participation in each counseling will be decided by the Institution based on vacancy position. **MERE PAYMENT OF COUNSELLING FEE DOES NOT ENSURE SELECTION / ADMISSION**

3.4. FEES AND DEPOSITS

Each selected candidate is required to pay tuition fees, examination fees, special fees, etc. as prescribed by the AIIRLIVAS from time to time. For detailed fee structure, please refer Appendix II (Page No. 32).

3.4.1. Fee Exemption for Students Admitted Under 7.5% Government School Quota

As per the G.O. 221 Higher Education (J2) dated 15.11.2021, the State Government will absorb the expenses for education in professional courses of students admitted under the 7.5% reservation for government school students (as specified by the State Government). The fees for counseling, tuition and hostel, would be paid by the Government itself. **They have to**

submit the proof for details of Government Schools in which studied from 6th Standard to 12th standard in Tamil Nadu.

3.4.2. First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession

In the G.O.(Ms) No.85 Higher Education(J2) Department dated 16.04.2010, the Government has ordered to grant tuition fee concession to the candidates, who are to be the first graduate in a family. If the applicant's brother or sister has already availed First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession for studying Professional Courses, then the applicant is not eligible for such concession. (Annexure III, Page No. 37)

4. SYSTEM OF EDUCATION

4.1. B.Tech (Dairy Technology / Poultry Technology / Food Technology) - Semester Course Credit System (8 Semesters)

The pattern of instruction and evaluation is the semester course credit system under the syllabus and regulations prescribed by the TANUVAS. An enrolled student should complete the course credits prescribed from time to time and shall have to earn a minimum Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) of **5.0 out of 10.0** in order to earn B.Tech (Dairy Technology) / B.Tech (Poultry Technology) / B.Tech (Food Technology) degree. The student shall satisfy the minimum residential requirement of 8 semesters of study including the compulsory in-plant training for one semester.

5. SCHOLARSHIPS/ LOANS

Scholarships such as SC / SCA / ST Welfare and Backward Class Scholarships, Scholarships given by Government of India, Government of Tamil Nadu and other Social Security and Welfare Schemes of Tamil Nadu are available for the deserving candidates admitted to the degree programme. The candidates should furnish copies of certificates (Annexure - III (a and b) as on Page Nos. 37 and 38) to the effect that he / she is the first graduate in his / her family from the appropriate authority along with the application. If the information furnished by him / her is found incorrect at a later stage, he/ she needs to repay the entire amount spent on him / her by the Government, besides legal action being initiated against him / her.

5.1. Post Matric Scholarship

SC / SCA / ST students

In the G.O. (Ms.) No. 6 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 09.01.2012; G.O. (Ms.) No. 92 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 11.09.2012; and G.O. (Ms.) No. 16 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated

24.02.2014, the Government has ordered to grant Post Matric Scholarship to SC / SCA / ST candidates and SC / SCA converted Christians, whose parental annual income is less than Rs. 2,50,000/- from all the sources shall only be eligible. The eligible candidates have to submit income certificate obtained from the appropriate authorities.

BC / MBC / Minorities students

In the G.O. (Ms.) No. 68 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dated 18.11.2021, the Government has ordered to grant Post Matric Scholarship to BC/MBC/Minority students. Candidates, whose parental annual income is less than Rs. 2,50,000/- from all the sources shall only be eligible. The eligible candidates have to submit income certificate obtained from the appropriate authorities.

5.2. FINANCIAL AID AND STUDENT LOANS (PM-VIDYALAXMI SCHEME)

The PM-Vidyalaxmi Scheme, a Government of India initiative offering collateral-free and guarantor-free education loans is available for all students who are getting admission in this Institution and who are desirous of availing education loans to pursue their higher education. The candidates can visit the portal <https://pmvidyalaxmi.co.in>. The portal does not charge any amount from the applicant. Through the portal, Candidates can:

- Apply to multiple banks for education loan
- Access collateral-free and guarantor-free education loans
- Benefit of interest subsidies available to eligible students as per scheme guidelines is accessible at https://www.education.gov.in/sites/upload_files/mhrd/files/document-reports/PM_Vidyalaxmi_Scheme_Guidelines.pdf

To address queries raised by the students, there is a dedicated Toll-free number 1800- 1031.

6. HOSTEL FACILITIES

- ❖ Hostel facilities for the students are available in Institution and the messes function on a dividend system / contract basis
- ❖ The students will be accommodated in the hostels to the extent possible, subject to availability
- ❖ A sum of Rs.5,000/- will be collected as caution deposit for hostellers
- ❖ In addition, the lodging fee of Rs. 1000/- will be collected annually by the concerned hostel authorities

7. PREVENTION OF RAGGING

Ragging is punishable as per Proceedings of the Supreme Court of India in SLP (C)

No.24295/2004 conveyed by the University Grants Commission, vide Letter No.F.1- 8/2006 (Cpp-II) dated 04.03.2008. **If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authorities, the concerned student shall be directed to explain and if his / her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority will expel him / her from the Institution.**

8. REGISTRATION AFTER ADMISSION

- A candidate who has been selected for admission to B.Tech (Dairy Technology) / B.Tech (Poultry Technology) / B.Tech (Food Technology) degree programme and paid the fees to secure the seat shall register for the requisite courses **within seven working days** from the date of commencement of registration for the first year, failing which his / her admission will stand cancelled automatically. Registration can be done **without fine on the first two working days and with a fine of Rs.100/- on the remaining five working days**
- A candidate who has paid the fees but fails to register on the date specified or fails to inform his / her intention of not registering for the course, **within one week** from the date specified for registration, is liable to forfeit the fees paid by him / her
- **Agreement and Surety bond:** Candidates selected for admission and his / her parent / guardian will have to execute an agreement bond during admission to college as prescribed in **Annexure IV and V as on Page No. 39 and 40**. Failure to execute the Agreement bond will lead to cancellation of selection
- **Physical fitness:** Candidates need to submit a physical fitness certificate (format prescribed by the institute) from the Government Medical Officer not below the rank of Civil Surgeon at the time of registration. If the candidate is certified to be unfit to pursue the study by the Government Medical Officer, he / she will not be permitted to register on any ground

9. DISCONTINUANCE

9.1. Before registration

A candidate, who intends to withdraw from the degree programme before registration, is entitled to get a refund of 80% of the tuition fee and 100% of all the other fees paid by him / her, provided the claim for refund is made **within one month** from the date notified for registration / commencement of classes. Otherwise, he / she is liable to forfeit the full fees paid for the admission.

9.2. Before the closure of admission

A student who desires to leave the degree programme after registering for the course and before the date of closure of admission, irrespective of the fact that he / she has attended the classes or not, is entitled to get a refund of 30% of the tuition fee and 50% of all the other fees except laboratory fund.

9.3. After the closure of admission

A student who desires to leave the degree programme after the closure of admission (as decided by the Institution) or on any date of subsequent years, irrespective of the fact that he / she has attended the classes or not, should pay a discontinuance fee of **Rs.3,00,000/-** (Rupees Three lakhs only) as per the bond executed as penalty.

hereinafter called "the sureties" on behalf of the candidate do hereby jointly and severally agree that in the event of the candidate committing any breach of any term of the above agreement to which breach the decision of the Institution shall be final and binding on the sureties, we shall pay the Institution on demand and without demur the sum of Rs.3,00,000/- (Rupees Three lakh only) or as the Chairman, Admission Committee (UG) may direct and we hereby bind ourselves and representatives for such payment. We further agree that any sum due hereunder shall be recovered as an arrear of land revenue.

We also agree that notwithstanding the provision of Section 133 and 135 of the India Contract Act, 1872 (Central Act IX of 1872) or any other rule of law or equity in that behalf, any indulgence of forbearance shown by the Government to the candidates or any variance in the terms of the contract with the candidate whether with or without the consent of the sureties or either of this shall not operate as a discharge of the sureties obligations under this bond.
